Miami Jewish Film Festival Presents Premiere of "Me, Japanese" at The Betsy Hotel

Documentary about Cuban Poet Jose Kozer closes The Betsy's annual Holocaust Literature Conference

MIAMI, FL – The Miami Jewish Film Festival (MJFF), in partnership with The Betsy Hotel, is proud to present the premiere of *Me, Japanese* on Tuesday, November 17th, at 7:00pm, on the closing night of the 2015 Jewish American & Holocaust Literature (JAHLIT) Conference. Local Miami filmmakers and *Me, Japanese* directors Malena Barrios and Marc Schloss will be present to introduce the unique themes addressed in the film and participate in an audience Q/A afterwards. This special event will take place on the Roof Deck at The Betsy Hotel as sunset, and will be free and open to the public. Space is limited to 100 patrons – rsvp to artsandculture@thebetsyhotel.com

Me, Japanese focuses on the life of Jose Kozer, the foremost Cuban poet of the 1960s, who has called Miami home for nearly a decade. Born in 1940 in Havana to Jewish immigrants who fled Eastern Europe to escape the Nazis, he himself became an exile after the Cuban Revolution, settling in New York City where he taught Spanish literature at Queens College. Kozer is associated with the "Neobarroco Movement," a poetic style similar to Surrealism. *Me, Japanese* introduces us to Kozer in a similar fashion, disregarding narrative and chronology as the poet reads from his work, muses on his philosophy and his search for the truth about his identity as an expatriate. Kozer challenges us to examine our own definition of identity as we question whether he is a literary genius or a deeply troubled individual finding refuge in his poems.

"We are delighted to continue to further our Festival's efforts to serve the entire arts & cultural scene in Miami and support unique local stories that are at the heart of what makes our city so special," said Miami Jewish Film Festival Director Igor Shteyrenberg. "Me, Japanese is an emotionally rich and complex film, and its dynamic filmmakers bring incredible depth and sensitivity to Jose Kozer's life story."
