The Beach at Harbour Village

I asked locals on Bonaire for the island's best beach and they steered me to this one at <u>Harbour Village</u>. Coral cliffs line much of Bonaire's coastline. So this beach is special, and yep, reserved just for the resort's guests.

Spacious Suites

Beach Suites include a kitchenette, living room, lanai and private patio. But my highlight was having my very own beach hammock, as well as a bathroom so big it deserves its own photo (stay tuned).



Gated Community

A 60-slip marina, a workout gym, spa treatments, shops, lounge rooms, a restaurant — no other resort on Bonaire offers so much, nor made it so easy to unplug and enjoy my vacation.



Welcoming Water Sports

Dive tours leave twice a day from <u>Harbour Village</u>, but the captain waved me and my snorkel gear aboard. Simply put, the 90-plus dive sites around Bonaire spark "wows!" at all depths.

Perfect Location (On Foot)

Downtown Kralendijk (the island's capital) is a 20-minute walk, or in my case, a picturesque snorkel from the resort. I finned my way up the shoreline's clear blue waters, and strolled into shops toting a mask and snorkel. On Bonaire, it's only natural.





Perfect Location (By Car)

A short drive to the north from <u>Harbour Village</u> lead me to Rincon, the island's oldest town. Eric at <u>Cadushy Distillery</u> dolled out some cactus-infused cocktails. Nearby, the Rose Inn served what locals claim is the island's best iguana soup. Think chicken soup with ... scales.



Fun Above the Water

Lac Bay is where I discovered local kids become the world's best windsurfers and star in <u>feature films</u>. It's also where shallow water and steady winds are ideal for learning to windsurf – especially in the mornings. Ask for Elvis at <u>Bonaire</u> <u>Windsurf Place</u>. Awesome Bathrooms

Most luxury resorts offer a bathtub or a shower. At <u>Harbour Village</u>, I had both, along with dual sinks and a sprawling vanity. Perfect for couples. Matching regal bathrobes included.



Pools, Pools, Pools

There are three pools at <u>Harbour Village</u>, and the sprawling 40-room resort with its 60-slip marina makes each of them feel private. This is the Kasa Coral pool, just behind the beach suites. There's also another tucked in near the spa, and I heard rumblings of a lap pool. It's very private. As in I'm still looking for it.
