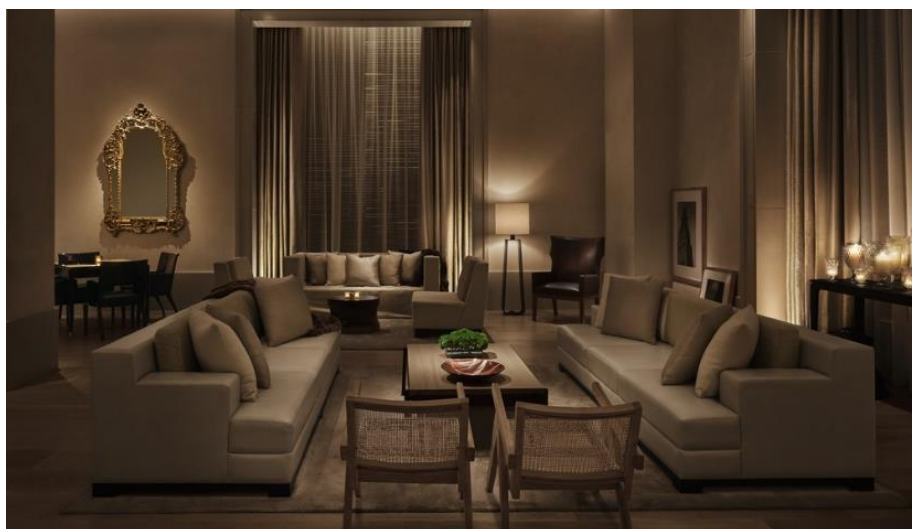


# Uber Wants to Give You a Free Night in a Boutique NYC Hotel

Of those entered, 200 winners will be met by an Uber driver who will deliver a gift pack that includes a card with full details of how to book a room at either the [The New York EDITION](#), [The Standard, High Line](#), 11 Howard, [The Standard, East Village](#), the Viceroy Central Park, [The Ludlow](#), [Hotel Hugo](#), or the [Roxy Hotel](#).

It's all part of the company's "5 Days of Giving"—winners will also get a swanky eye mask from celeb-favorite designer Olivia von Halle to complement those blackout curtains.

Though this is the first time the company has given away hotel stays, Uber has already made passengers happy by giving away free pizza, copies of a new EA Sports video game and an Xbox One S, and 15-minute cuddle sessions with puppies. What's next, Uber? Brad Pitt handing out free cash?
