If you're lucky enough to [travel down to the Caribbean](#), you do NOT want to skimp on a hotel that [doesn't measure up](#) to its spectacular surroundings.

Consider the [Zemi Beach House](#) instead. It's the new [best beach hotel in the world](#), according to the annual Best of the Best awards from luxury hotel deals site [Jetsetter](#).

The 69-suite resort lies on the remote island of [Anguilla](#), which [doesn't even have direct flights](#) from the U.S. Once travelers arrive, though, they're rewarded with a resort spa tucked in a 300-year-old [Thai house](#), a [mud deck](#), [immaculate suites](#) and views of an ocean so sparkling, it almost hurts to look:

Zemi Beach House [opened just a few months ago](#), and the island is [enjoying a comeback](#) after getting an initial boost in tourism about two decades ago, according to the New York Times.

“Fronting Shoal Bay East’s two-mile stretch of fine white sand, [the hotel has an array of water sports including snorkeling, kite surfing and boat racing](#),” Jetsetter raves. “Personally, we’d recommend pulling a Bey and Jay and chartering a yacht—just one of many customized concierge services at your disposal. Back on land, get a heavenly taste of the island’s flavors at 20 Knots, where fresh-caught seafood and Tiki-style drinks come with a side of ocean breezes.”

Anguilla is known for being [less touristy than other Caribbean islands](#) due to its remoteness. To get there, you’ll probably have to [fly from Puerto Rico](#) or take a boat or plane from nearby [St. Maarten](#) or another neighboring island. As a result, its [beaches will stun](#) even the savviest travelers.

Hotel rooms at Zemi Beach House start at [about \\$350 per night](#) on Jetsetter, though they’re [priced much higher](#) on the resort’s website.

Too complicated or pricey? You can always try a low-key, [all-inclusive spot](#) instead.
